Homework Challenge – Summer 2nd 2024

We are going to be learning about lots of different topics and the following are all ideas that tie in with these:

<p><u>Science- Magnets and Materials</u> Gather some everyday items from around your home and sort them by material e.g. metal, wood, paper. Use a magnet to test the materials to find out if they are magnetic or not.</p> 	<p><u>History - Parliament and the Role of Prime Ministers</u> Draw/write to share your ideas about what makes a 'good' Prime Minister.</p> 	<p><u>Maths</u> Telling the time For one day, write down the times when you did something, for example, what was the time on the clock when you had your breakfast? When you had your lunch? When you had your dinner? Could you draw the clock and label it?</p> 
<p><u>Writing</u> Write your reflections of your time in Year 1. This could include your favourite friends, favourite subjects, special activities you have enjoyed e.g. trips/enrichment activities.</p> 	<p><u>RE - Judaism</u> Can you make a fact file to show case what you have learnt about Judaism?</p> 	<p><u>Art - Sculpture</u> Can you make a sculpture inspired by nature? You might like to use tin foil, dough, papier mâché or construction toys.</p> 

The challenge work is due in **Monday 8th July 2024** and during the week there will be time for each child to present their work and for it to be celebrated.

This work can be completed in their '*Challenge book*'. It is completely up to the children to decide how they want to record it. They could use photos, diagrams, drawings or something else! All we ask is that everyone has a go, so they all have something to share at the end of each half-term.
